

## Signs along the RAVeL

## Police signs

Depending on the category of user being shown, this sign indicates a trail that is reserved for cyclists and/or pedestrians and/or horse riders.





If the sign shows two types of user separated by a white line, this indicates which side of the trail each user should stick to.

Users are not allowed to put each other in danger or obstruct each other. They should be doubly vigilant in the presence of children and must not obstruct traffic without reason.

## Directional signs

These signs indicate the direction of recommended route for specific users: pedestrians and/or cyclists and/or horse riders, depending on the symbols shown.

These signs also include destinations that are far away (towns and cities, even relatively distant, which offer a large number of services) or closer (the next closest locality), giving their distances and an arrow indicating their direction.

Beneath this directional sign you will find a plaque identifying the number or logo of the long-distance route you are following (e.g. "9", "Vennbahn") along with the RAVel identifier (e.g. "Line 48").
